Dear Hampton Middle School Community,

This year at HMS, we are excited to announce a new project for eighth grade students during their Career Awareness course rotation. We have revised our curriculum to include a unit on financial literacy, in addition to the unit on career exploration. We have partnered with the Clearview Federal Credit Union to allow our students to participate in a "Reality Fair" as a culminating project for the course. The purpose of this project is to promote financial literacy for our students and give them practice budgeting and making financially sound decisions. As part of this hands-on activity, students will visit several different themed booths to decide how they will strategically manage a prescribed salary. Each student's salary will directly connect with their career of choice to which they also researched and interviewed throughout the course.

To successfully implement this project, we need the help of our dedicated parents and community members to run the Reality Fair booths. There will be approximately ten booths for our students to visit, including housing, transportation, insurance, entertainment, utilities, etc. The Reality Fair will take place five different times throughout the year to give all eighth grade students an opportunity to participate when they complete the Career Awareness course rotation. Please feel free to volunteer for as few or as many days as you would like.

Your assistance will be needed from approximately 7:50am-9:30am on the days that you volunteer. This time period includes an overview of your responsibilities prior to students joining the event. All materials are provided, and no prior preparation or planning is needed. The dates of the Reality Fair are as follows:

- *Monday, April 17th*
- *Tuesday, June 6th*

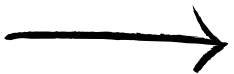
